Logistics: origin




- The term logistics comes from the begining of 19th century, from French word "logistique".
- The first time the term "logistique" is used in the military literature it is in 1830, what it meant *major-géneral de logis*.
- The first logistic group in military was developed during the so called the First Polish War (1807) in Ostróda by Napoleon Bonaparte.
- Logistics was a military term the organisation of moving, lodging and supplying troops and equipment.



Logistics: road map












Optimazation dilemma:






Optimazation dilemma:






Optimazation model: cost A and cost B

Logistics: **definition** What is logistics? (1/2)

- The detailed <u>coordination</u> of a <u>complex</u> operation involving many 1) people, 2) facilities, or 3) supplies
 [Oxford Dictionary].
 - The management of the <u>flow</u> of resources, between the point of origin and the point of destination in order to meet some requirements, for example of customers or corporations [Wikipedia].
- The coordination and optimazation of 1) physical goods (people), 2) financial flow and 3) information flow

Logistics: **definition** What is logistics? (2/2)



- Logistics is concerned with the organization, movement and storage of material and people.
- The domain of logistics activities is providing customers with the <u>right</u> product, int the <u>right</u> place, at the <u>right</u> time (8R Rule).
- The fundamental characteristics of contemporary logistics is its holistic, integrated view of all the activities that it encompases.

*Work with Inventory Team to Project Manage major Inventory reduction initiatives (i.e. VMI, Kanban implementation.)


*Manage shipping and Freight forwarding contractors and drive for minimum cost solutions in-conjunction with supply chain

*Lead logistics activities / initiatives associated with implementing the Porsche 'Line Back' concept *Work with export team to ensure that all shipments comply to regulations

*Optimise / manage a strategic drop shipment process between Actuation Systems locations *Work with the SI&OP Director to continuously improve processes to increase performance *Manage sub contract logistics support staff (OCS)

 - logistics <u>network</u> design,
 - <u>inventory</u> management,
 - supply/demand <u>planning</u>.




